


Kids Matter Update: Sandra Mauger

Chair for the evening, Jan Tsoutouras introduced Sandra Mauger, principal of East Torrens Primary School. Our Club has sponsored the mentor program, that is a vital part of this program. Sandra was here to update us on the progress for these last 18 months.

What is Kids Matter?

KidsMatter is the first national mental health promotion, prevention and early intervention initiative specifically developed for primary schools. Currently being trialled in 101 schools across Australia, KidsMatter involves the people who have a significant influence on children's lives - parents, families, care-givers, teachers and **community groups** - in making a positive difference for children's mental health during this important developmental period.

KidsMatter has been developed in collaboration with the Com Government, beyondblue: Principals Australia and **supported by the Australian Rotary Health Research Fund.**

Four areas have been identified

where schools can strengthen their students' mental health and wellbeing.

1. A positive school community
2. Social and emotional learning
3. Parenting support & education
4. Early intervention for students experiencing mental health difficulties

Sandra thanked our cub for it's support which went into funding the mentoring of nine 13 yr old students to facilitate their transition to secondary school. She emphasised that all 60 staff at the school are taking the program seriously, which is coordinated by. Assistant Principal, Lyn Gentilcore who is always looking for mentors and volunteers.

The school has 300 pupils. Their New Arrivals Program is helped with KidsMatter. They have 52 different cultures in the school. Many families arrive without English as business migrants, refugees or students.

Some of the refugee students exhibit similar behaviours as those who have been tortured. 92 students have some disability.

What can we Do? Volunteer for:

- Mentor program for 1:1 with students for 1hr/week
- Every Child Every Day Reading program. Volunteers hear reading for .half an hour from 9am to 1pm for 1 to 5 days a week

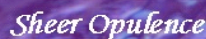
