Acting President Jeff's Report

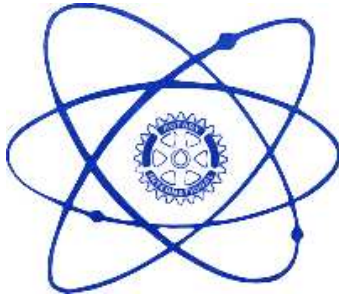
- 1 President Lin is unable to attend tonight's meeting and has asked Past President Jeff to conduct tonight's meeting. Vice President Peter is also unavailable.
- 1 President Lin and Lyn attended a Campbelltown Council dinner last Wednesday night. The dinner was to celebrate the work done by volunteers connected with Council activities. A number of volunteers were recognised for their years of service to the local community.
- 1 Four Club members attended the District Assembly at Waikerie yesterday. Several new approaches will be considered during 2009/2010.

The Challenges of the Ageing Ethnic Communities

With the unavailability of the scheduled speaker, Tony Lagozzino introduced the President of the Coordinating Italian Committee (CIC), Silvio Iadorola, who told us about the issues of providing health services and caring for the ageing people of non-English speaking backgrounds (NESB). Those with an Italian background form the largest group of NESBs and many people in this group live in the area served by our Club.

Traditionally, it has been expected that the younger generations of Italian families would care for the elderly at home, but, as with the rest of society, the concept of the stay-at-home mother, who is also able to care for the grandparents, has become another economic casualty of our modern society. In general, older Italians now require as much structured community support as everyone else. By 2016, people more than 65 years old and from an Italian background are expected to comprise a quarter of the older Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) population and they will form 8% of the total older S.A. population.

While there are several hundred "Italian" organisations in South Australia, the Coordinating Italian Committee has found that achieving any significant level of cooperation has been an on-going difficult challenge. Hence the formation of the Comitato Assistenza Agli Italiani (CO.AS.IT) to provide assistance to needy Italians. This new organisation has achieved good initial successes, but there is a perception that both it and the CIC coordinating committee are adequately funded by the profits of the annual Carnevale. Sadly, Carnevale's profits are not nearly enough for all the demands and therefore funding from external sources such as Governments has become essential. And, as always, the increasing demand for services must be balanced against the other competing calls on the limited sources of funds. A challenge for the future!



The Four Rotary Avenues of Service (from Past President Jeff)

For years, Rotary’s commitment to Service Above Self has been channelled through the following four Avenues of Service, which form the foundation of club activity.

Club Service focuses on strengthening fellowship and ensuring the smooth functioning of Rotary clubs.

Vocational Service involves club members serving others through their professions and aspiring to high ethical standards. Rotarians, as business leaders, share skills and expertise through their vocations, and they inspire others in the process.

Community Service is the opportunity Rotary clubs have to implement club projects and activities that improve life in the local community.

International Service encompasses efforts to expand Rotary’s humanitarian reach around the world and to promote world understanding and peace. It includes everything from contributing to Polio Plus to helping Rotary Youth Exchange students adjust to their host countries.
