### The May 2009 Club Assembly

Following last Monday's regular meeting, a Club Assembly was held and senior Club officers presented their interim reports. These reports provided the opportunity for Club members to raise any pressing issues.

Each presenter provided a summary of the year-to-date achievements of their office or their committee and compared the actual achievements against those planned at the start of the year.

The many important items included the following highlights:-

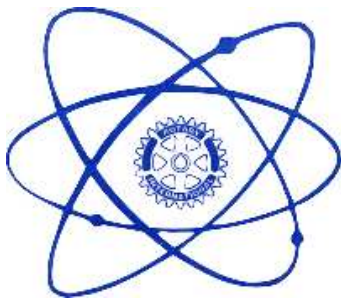
The President reported that retention of the current committee structure has proven to be very successful with all committees being active and successful.

A most comprehensive Treasurer's Report showed combined total income for the Club and Project Accounts totalling \$141,000 so far with \$75,000 on hand. Two donations of \$5000 were made towards Victorian bushfire relief programs with \$5000 going to the school in Tanzania. It was requested that a summary of the key donations be displayed at the Shed.

The forthcoming 2000<sup>th</sup> meeting will be an opportunity to show our appreciation and thanks to our partners.

The lists of achievements by all committees was impressive, including the many international activities, fundraising, membership recruitment and retention, fellowship, vocational service, next generations (youth) and the developing risk management area. Donations to local needy causes were featured and a major local community project for next year was outlined.

President Elect Scott distributed the list of draft committees for 2009/2010 (see page 5 of this Newsletter). Constructive feedback is welcomed.

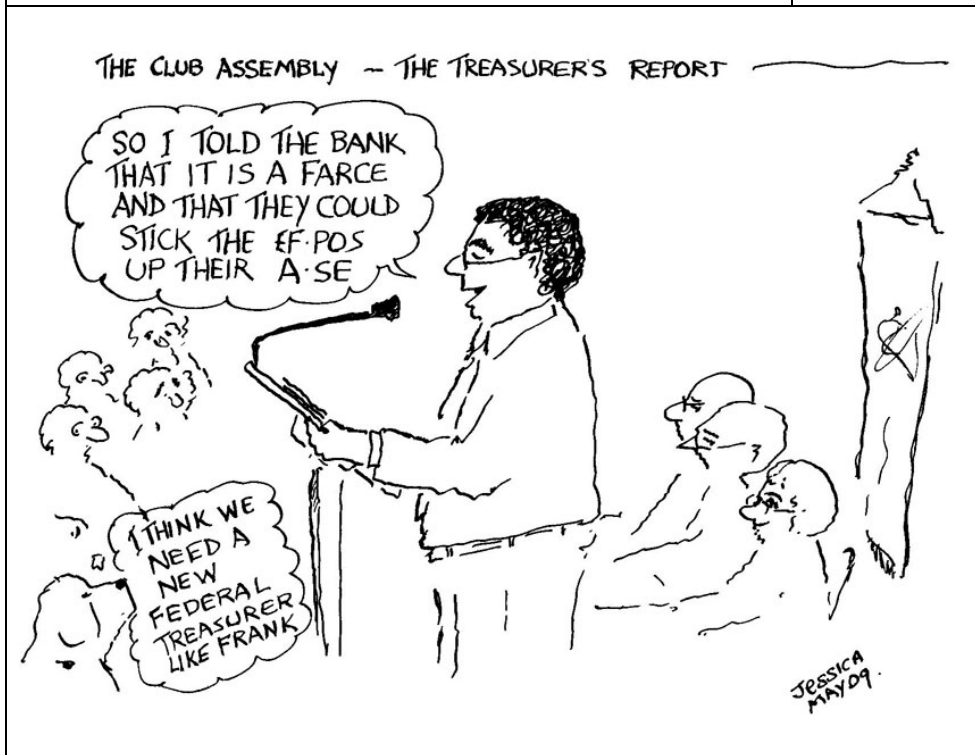
