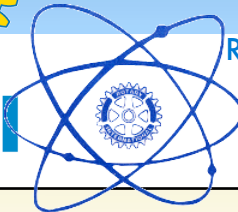

- Skiing here is like the beginners slopes in Europe.
- Meeting other exchange students was a highlight. This occurred at the Mt Gambier Conference, the Renmark weekend and the Lameroo country experience, where she sheared a sheep. MC said that she did such a bad job on that
