### Campbelltown Library – Community Resource

Our guest speaker, Ursula Hickey addressed our Club on the subject of the Campbelltown City Council Library Services.

The library membership totals 22,000 out of a population of 47,000. The aim is to increase the membership to 80% of the population.

The physical facilities include the main library on Montacute Road, the Branch and Toy Library at Athelstone, the Mobile Library and the Library delivery service.

There are half a million loans of items each year, with an average of 15,000 people accessing the library services each month.



The books and other items available for loan total 80,000. It is planned to increase this to 120,000. The longer term intention is to join a network of a number of libraries, giving access to 180,000 items.

Ms Hickey provided an overview of the non-traditional library services, which included free internet access, including wireless service, Justice of Peace services, items in Italian and Chinese languages, and a toy library and so on.

The existing facilities are undergoing a substantial upgrade, with assistance of Federal Government a grant of \$3Mill., to increase the size, facilities and services of the Library.
