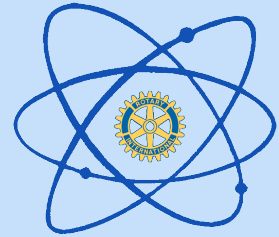

and the Adelaide Hills. This has fallen from approximately 11,600 gigitalitres to 5,600 gigitalitres.

Underpinning this discussion is the clearly demonstrated increase in average temperatures over the past decade. *[It is presumed that this has several additive effects, including greater loss to evaporation from storage, decreased inflows because of dryer catchment and greater demand for domestic and agricultural uses (Ed)].*

The impact of restrictions on domestic use has reduced the Adelaide “thirst” from about 200 gigitalitres per year to somewhere around 150 to 175 gigitalitres.

The proposed government strategies to rebalance the equation include;

- Desalination providing 100 gigLs (half our current consumption),
- Re-use of the treated waste water, for irrigation and flushing toilets, saving 75 GigLs of water from current sources, and
- Recycling storm water saving 60 GigLs.

The question on every body’s mind is ‘will we ever be free of water restrictions’ or more significantly, will we have enough water for our critical needs. Our guest speaker, Michael Leak went some way to explaining why we have the current shortages, why there will be a shortage of water in the future and what is being done to address this critical need.

Michael outlined the background to his address by demonstrating the falling inflows into both the main sources of Adelaide water, the Murray Darling basin

In the course of his discussion, Michael indicated that the desalination process consisted of forcing sea water through

millions of very fine microtubes under very high pressure. The water passes through more readily than the salt. The stormwater harvesting requires three critical elements to be successful – a river system, an ability to trap/catch the water, and an aquifer into which it can be pumped for storage. These three elements are present in some parts of the Adelaide metropolitan area.

Strategies, available and more relevant to individuals, that contribute to a reduction in water consumption, include the use of pool covers, and installation of hot water recyclers. The latter recycles the cold water from the hot water tap, and mention was made of a subsidy for installation.

(Editorial comment: The time constraints prevented questions, which might have raised the issue of the use of household rainwater harvesting, and the use of other devices, such as the engineering that allows hand washing with the clean water while it is filling the toilet cistern)
