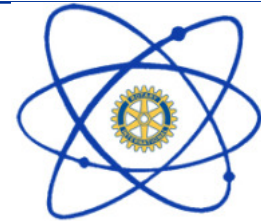

## Current Issues in the Law

Dr Rick Sarre is Professor of Law and Criminal Justice at the University of South Australia's School of Commerce. His teaching duties include various aspects of commercial law, criminal justice and media law in Adelaide and Hong Kong. He currently serves as the President of the South Australian Institute of Justice Studies Inc. and is on the national research coordinating committee of the Australian Law Teachers Association and vice president of the Australian New Zealand Society of Criminology.

He graduated in law from the University of Adelaide in 1974, and has an MA in Criminology from the University of Toronto and has a Doctor of Legal Science degree from the University of Canberra.

He has held several distinguished teaching posts internationally and has published extensively.

The title of his entertaining and attention hold-

ing address to the Club was "Some Current Legal Issues in the Law". He introduced his topic by referring to the story in the Advertiser about the 2 policemen who suffered psychological trauma as result of what they saw when they arrived at the scene of a railway accident. Their attempt to claim damages was not successful because the law requires that they should have actually witnessed the accident. He went on to recount relevant detail from three cases of claims for damages. In each case, damages were awarded in a lower court but were reduced on appeal to the High Court. These cases were used to illustrate the very difficult nature of the law relating to negligence. The Club was privileged to have an address from such a distinguished academic.
