

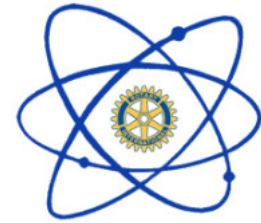

## Human Rights

The guest speaker at the City of Campbelltown annual dinner for service club members, was the former Senator, Chris Schacht. He addressed the couple of hundred members of various service clubs from within the City of Campbelltown on his experiences in life that relate to human rights.

He gave as his first example, his experience when having a picnic at Thorndon Park with his family. He noticed the groups of picnickers that gave some indication of the diversity of ethnic-

ity in our local community.

He approached a nearby group and asked about their origins. They were of Persian background for Iraq. They invited him to join them for lunch.

The next group was young lads of Chinese appearance playing backyard cricket using a tree as the wicket. They were speaking with obvious Australian accent.

The other four groups included a large group of Australians of Caucasian background, enjoying an engagement party, and a

group people of Vietnamese origin, a group of people of Cambodian origin, and another group, which he thought probably came from Afghanistan, but they had arrived in Australia only recently, and spoke little English.

Chris also spoke about his experiences meeting a range of people who stood up for democratic rights at great personal cost. Among the examples he gave was Aung San Suu Kyi, the leader of the Burmese pro-democracy movement and Desmond Tutu.



**Annual Service Clubs' Dinner:**

Mayor Simon Brewar from the City of Campbelltown, hosted the annual dinner for members of service clubs in the city at the newly completed Rezz function room, which was being used for the first time.

He extended a warm welcome to all present, particularly to the guest speaker, former senator, Chris Schacht. Also, a very welcome guest was Wally Gradara, who was representing Ballast Stone winery.

A number of Councilors also attended the dinner.

The service clubs of Athelstone Lions, Rostrevor-Campbelltown Lions, Morialta Rotary, Magill Sunrise Rotary, Campbelltown Rotary, Athelstone Kiwanis and North - East Sunset Inner Wheel, present for the first time, were represented at the dinner.

Guest speaker, Chris Schacht, at the invitation of the Mayor, had nominated Amnesty International as the organization to benefit from the table raffle, which raised \$523.

Wally Gradara spoke briefly about the history of Ballast Stone winery, the source of the name and the current products. The Shaw family established the winery, beginning with a few hectares and gradually expanding to a total of 1200 hectares of vineyards. It is understood that the wines are available from the Rezz bottle shop.

Cellar door sales are also available from the winery at Myrtle Grove Rd, Currency Creek and at Signal Point, Wharf Precinct, Goolwa.

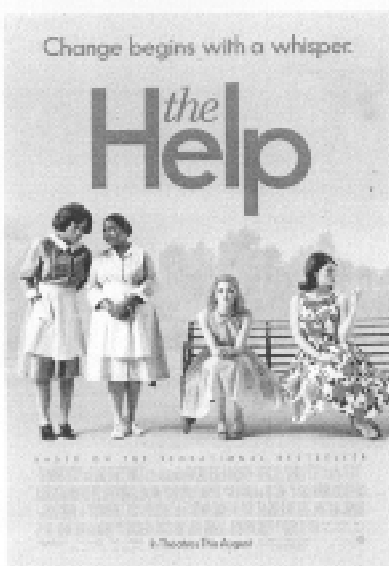
**Chris Schacht** was trained as a school teacher in the 1960s in South Australia and after a short period of teaching he took up a full-time position with the Australian Labour Party and in the following 33 years he held various full-time positions in the Labour Party as a ministerial advisor to State and Federal Ministers. He served in the Australian Senate from 1987-2002 during which time he was a member and chair of the prestigious Joint Foreign Affairs and Trade Committee. He was founding chairman of the Australian Parliament's Human Rights sub-committee

Non-executive director of Craft South (The Craft Association of South Australia). He is also a member of China Cluster Group, the South Australian Wine Industry Council, the Australian Institute of Company Directors, CEDA and SA Great. He is a Trustee of the South Australian Governor's Leadership Foundation. He also works as an advisor and consultant providing strategic advice to Australian and International companies and is a regular media commentator on politics in Australia. ("BioAngels" web page)

From 1993-1996 he at various times held the following ministerial positions: Minister for Science, Minister for Small Business, Minister for Construction, Minister for Customs, Minister responsible for the Patents Office, Minister responsible for Metrology Policy, Minister responsible for Australian Space Policy and Minister responsible for the Franchising Code.

From 1996-1998 he was Shadow Minister for Communications and from 1998-2001 he was Shadow Minister for Veteran's Affairs.

Chris is currently Chairman of the Australian China Development Company, the President of the Australian Volleyball Federation, a non-executive director of Marathon Resources (a publicly listed mining exploration company) and
