ROUND AUSTRALIA SAFARI - TO PROMOTE AWARENESS OF MENTAL ILLNESS

A six-month Safari travelling right round Australia will seek to raise awareness and understanding of mental illness as part of Rotary's centenary celebrations. On February 23rd 2005 Rotary worldwide celebrated its 100th birthday and the Australian Rotary Health Research Fund (ARHRF) launched the Rotary Health Safari to help Australians become more aware of mental illness, an ongoing project of the Research Fund which in 2005 celebrates its 25th Anniversary. Since 1980 the Fund, which annually allocates over a million dollars towards medical research in Australia, has become recognised as one of the most important private medical research organisations. The Rotary Health Safari will cover 35,000 kms in 6 months, leaving Sydney on July 1st 2005 and finishing back in Sydney on December 16th. It will drive through all twenty-three Rotary districts and visit as many Rotary clubs as possible. The Safari will be led by a 31 foot long Winnebago "Explorer" motor home on loan to Rotary from Winnebago Industries which in 2005 celebrates 40 years of operation in Australia. The support vehicle will be a Peugeot 407 Touring loaned to Rotary by Peugeot Automobiles Australia. The Safari was launched in Martin Place, Sydney, by the Hon. Tony Abbott, Minister for Health and Ageing. The ARHRF will be working with the national depression initiative *beyondblue* in arranging Mental Health Awareness community forums during the Safari. The purpose-built Winnebago will carry a demountable display to showcase the work done by the ARHRF plus interactive screens using *beyondblue* depression programmes. The Winnebago and Peugeot will be parked at high profile locations during the trip for the public to learn of the work done by the

ARHRF in the field of mental health – especially children's mental health. As well as Winnebago, *beyondblue* and Peugeot, other sponsors who have already committed support for the Rotary Health Safari include Harvey Norman, Australia Post, Golden Chain Motor Inns, Hema Maps, Motorola, Gull Petroleum, Omnitrack, Transtrack and L J Hooker (Dural). Rotarians and motor home owners will be invited to make up a Safari "Tail" as it travels around Australia bringing their own caravans and motor homes. "This is possibly the most exciting concept ever organised to promote both Rotary in Australia and the Australian Rotary Health Research Fund" said Richard White, Chairman of the Rotary Health Safari Committee. "Clubs on the Safari route will hold special welcoming functions inviting local business people to join in and discover for themselves what a relevant and vital organisation Rotary is in Australia today".
