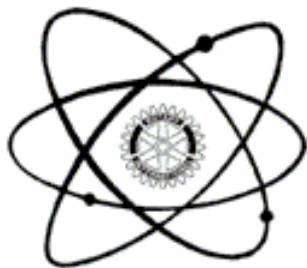

2007 Council on Legislation

The Council on Legislation – Rotary’s parliament – meets every three years to deliberate and act up-on all

proposed enactments and resolutions submitted by clubs, district conferences, the General Council, the Conference of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland, and the Rotary International Board. The council itself also makes proposals. The Council is composed of more than 500 representatives from every part of the Rotary world. Voting members include one elected representative of the clubs of each Rotary district. Non-voting members include the chair and vice chair of the Council, and others, including the RI president and members of the RI Board and past RI presidents. The Council first convened in 1934 as an integral part of that year’s international convention in Detroit. In 1970, it was constituted as the legislative body of RI, no longer to function just in an advisory capacity. Actions of the Council are subject to review by all Rotary clubs prior to being incorporated into the *Manual of Procedure*. The next Council on Legislation is scheduled to take place on 22-28 April 2007 in Chicago.

Rotary International Public Relations Award



The purpose of this award is to recognize Rotary clubs that have generated increased awareness and understanding of Rotary

through outstanding media coverage or public relations efforts. Competition and selection of winning entries take place at the district level.

Eligible nominees - Public relations activities that are initiated up to one year prior to 15 March are eligible for the competition.

Selection

Process - District governors must submit the nomination form and supporting materials to Rotary International for consideration by a review committee appointed by the RI president. **Deadline:** 15 May
