**GUEST SPEAKER**

Chairman Daryl Webb introduced the guest speaker Rotarian Brenton Lewis.

Brenton Lewis is the Chief Executive of Murraylands Regional Development Board. He has been a member of the board for the past 9 years.

Brenton used a Powerpoint to illustrate Murraylands investment opportunities. Murraylands covers areas from Morgan to Coorong, it is a big and very diverse region with the following background; population – 36000, workforce – 15000, unemployed – 5%, youth – 25%.

Brenton explained the emerging investment opportunities that they have identified. These include;

- ❖ Transport logistics/Intermodal Hub – negotiations with the Minister are underway of the possibility to have metropolitan bus and train services extended to Murray Bridge. Also there are plans to build an Airport at Monarto South – intermodal.
- ❖ Education – there are plans to expand Murray Bridge TAFE to offer Vocational and University education.
- ❖ Health Care – there is a proposal to establish a health care centre within Murray Bridge.
- ❖ Housing – there are huge for housing growth to accommodate migrants coming to take up jobs in industry.
- ❖ Retail – there is going to be a lot of growth in retail with a proposal to build Bunnings in Murray Bridge and expanding Mannum shopping centre.

Each Rotarian received a folder with detailed information.

Brenton also touched on challenges ahead of us. He sited water as a major challenge since Murray river is allocated only 2% and warned full disaster is yet to unfold and there is need to examine the best economic use of underground water. Another challenge is workforce, it needs to meet the increasing demand of employers for labour. Migrants also pose another challenge with regards its social impact.
