Rural Press-Vocational Visit

Trevor Channon the General Manager of Rural Press gave us a brief account of the business. The company has been running for 30 years, but the new site was opened in November 2006. Currently they have 16 full time workers and run two shifts.

A new automatic press machine with 6 towers of press was recently bought from China for 8million dollars. This machine does everything in one run and is capable of printing 35000 copies an hour. Printing is done on Australian and Indonesian news print paper and the paper is recycled in Asia.

The main paper printed at the Rural Press is Murray Valley Standard. However, 70% of the business is external work, printing 74 different papers every year. Some of the papers printed are; Financial Review, Flinders News, Port Augusta paper, Kangaroo Island news, Alice Springs paper, Trading Post, Chinese paper, Adelaide Review and the Independent Paper.

Hayley Cahalan the Editor of Murray Valley Standard took round the sales department which is responsible for getting information sent to Standard office. She told us that this department is also a fabulous training ground for journalists. We had a tour of the printing hall where we were shown the magnificent press at work.
