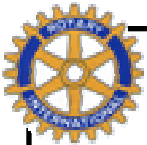

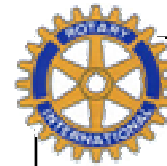

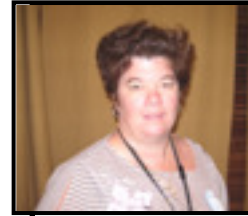

Digressing, don't forget the Harry Potter preview next week as one of our fund raising activities.

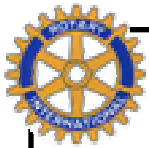

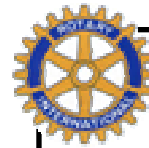

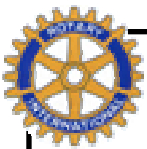

Natasha's induction into Rotary was as a Team Member of the Group Study Exchange to Norway in 2007 and joined the worldwide family of Rotary Alumni.

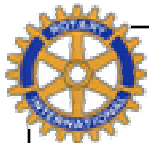


1998 - 1999 'Follow your Rotary Dream'

## 'Rotary Awareness'

***Make a special effort to become more familiar with Rotary – its history and its diverse programs as we work together to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world.***

### **What is Rotary's Youth Exchange Program?:**

The program's is an international project which enables young people between the ages of 15 and 19 years to travel to distant parts of the world to study for one year in an entirely different environment. The student is given the opportunity to experience, first hand, the culture, language and day to day life in another country as they are accepted into the families of their Rotary hosts and whilst attending high school.

Outbound students are responsible for the provision of round trip airfares, clothing, health insurance and incidental expenses.

The sponsoring Rotary Club usually provides the student with an exchange blazer and assistance with other costs depending upon circumstances . A counsellor is also appointed to keep in touch with the student during their time away.

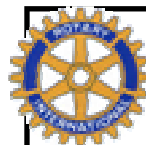
The host Rotary club accepts the responsibility for providing host families and a monthly living allowance for the student as well as providing for any school requirements. A Rotarian counsellor is appointed to co-ordinate activities for the student as well as providing advisory and counselling support to the student during their stay.

There is a definite ambassadorial role implied in the exchange with students being expected to impart as much knowledge as they can about their own country. Students are also given the opportunity to become a part of their host Rotary club and visit other clubs during their stay.

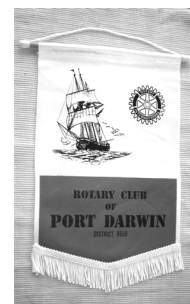
