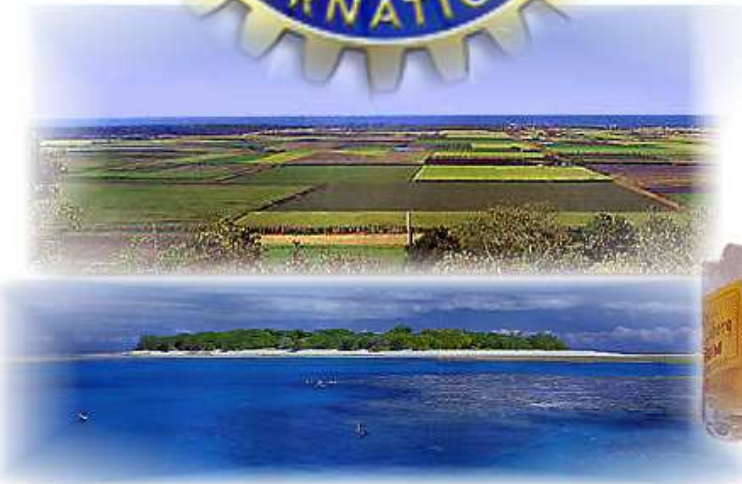

Guest Speaker was our own David Praed who has recently returned from England.

David and Ann went there on family business not a holiday although he did manage to travel a bit.

His main purpose of the trip was to visit his sick sister who had a devastating stroke seven years ago and is now in care.

His trip started rather poorly as the plan from Bundaberg was faulty and a new one was sent from Bris. This made them two hours late and they only just made their connection to Brunei then to Dubai.

At Brunei they met Bob Gallagar (Rotarian from Bundaberg) who happened to be on the same flight. Also started talking to other passengers waiting to transfer and discovered that they had flown in from Perth and had worked at the same mine as a relative (Len) and that Len was in charge of the office the lady worked at.

Arrived in Heathrow at 6am and given keys to hire car and told it is in parking lot. Not even told what sort of car or more precise directions other than the rego

number. Had to wander the lot until they found it. It was a VW Golf and most controls were in different places than here in Aus. Found out most controls while actually driving. Then drove 1 ½ hours to Gravesend Kent. Booked at a motel that advertised 29 pounds per night but this was false and they paid around 70 pounds.

He found most were bad drivers and very impatient. As David would need to look for signs etc this caused him to be honked at a number of times.

They stayed with relatives most of the time or in B& B s when they could. They found the wrong inn once (two of the same type in town) then got lost trying to find the right one. A semi driver helped them find the correct one by having them follow him through town. (I can't imagine too many lorry drivers doing that).

Visited sight of the Doc Martin TV show (Port Issac) and it is exactly as shown on the show.

Costs a lot to park and this makes the travelling very expensive overall as petrol is about 3 pounds a litre. (about \$5.50)

Made way to St Ives (David's ancestral home) which has mostly one way streets, as roads too narrow to pass. This caused a bit of a problem.

Visited a few relatives and friends and visited Treventhoe House (family history) and had Cornish Pasties. The real thing and had a good feed. Fantastic!!

Saw the "Eden Project" started in 1988. This is basically six large domes which have different world area ecologies.

Discovered a cousin also named David but 20 yrs younger.

Visited Plymouth/ Bournemouth and caught up with some ex service mates.

Drove back to Heathrow and flew out. On arriving in Brisbane they made their way to a hotel that David had booked before leaving. As they new they would be late the landlord had give David the combination to the Key Safe and was told that his room number would be marked. But when he opened the safe there where

only two keys in it neither marked. So he chose one and they settled in for the night. (after midnight). In the morning the receptionist couldn't find any Record of them or a booking.

Well at least they had a bed when they got home.

David was thanked for his talk.

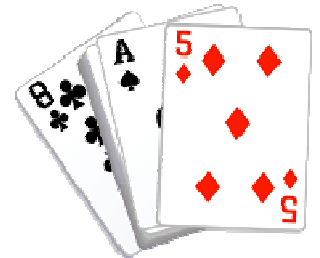

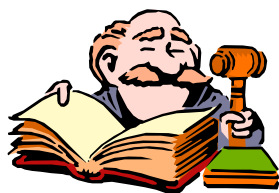
