In the Kremlin in Moscow is the largest caliber cannon ever made. It weighs 40 tonnes with a barrel 3.18 metres long and with a bore of 920mm. It has never been fired.



The Kremlin also houses the heaviest bell. It weighs 196 tonnes and stands 5.9 metres tall. It was cast in 1735 but cracked 2 years later in a fire. It stands on a platform and has never been rung.



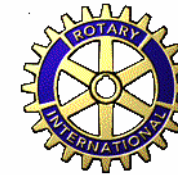
The Kremlin is a 28 hectare complex meaning "town fortress". It consists of palaces, cathedrals and churches and was begun in the 10th century.

FACTS ABOUT THE ROTARY CLUB OF CABRAMATTA

INC. Rotary International is the association of Rotary clubs around the world. Clubs work on projects relating to health, hunger, environmental concerns, literacy and vocational assistance, drug abuse and assisting senior citizens and younger people. Club members support projects internationally through their own contacts with Rotarians in other countries and through participation in the program of the Rotary Foundation. Membership in a Rotary club is by invitation of a recognized business and profession working or living in the geographic area from which the club may draw members. The classification system ensures a wide cross section of the community's interests, vocations and activities.

The Rotary Club of Cabramatta Inc was chartered on 1st March 1960 with a membership of 24. The club now has 17 members, but what we lack in numbers we make up in enthusiasm and we meet every Monday evening at the Cabramatta Bowling Club. Normal meetings include fellowship at 6.00 p.m. followed by the formal call to order at 6.15 p.m. During the meeting a meal is served. Directors reports are given, items of general interest are discussed and an address is given by a guest speaker on a variety of informative, topical and educational subjects. Meetings generally conclude at approximately 8.00 p.m.

Members are appointed each year to serve on a committee on one of the "Avenues of Service" which are **Club** (which includes fellowship), **Community, International, Vocational and Youth Service.** As in all involvement in Rotary, the time given is personal and voluntary. Some of the projects have been sponsoring students to summer Science Forum in Canberra for 2 weeks, camps for RYLA, RYPEN, organize Red Shield Appeal for the Salvation Army, bush dances to raise money for Children's Hospital, local hospitals, Les Powell School for students with severe disabilities. The Police Officer of the Year Award is another worthwhile community event which we have undertaken, which shows the community what great law enforcement officers we have, and also promoting Rotary as well. Youth programs such as school students nights, both high and primary schools, manage and support Rumbriah Hall a community hall at Canley Heights, Christmas raffles and catering days as well as running a very successful Conference are just some of the worthwhile projects along with our great fellowship days all make up what the Rotary Club of Cabramatta Inc is about.

PROFILE ON THE LIFE OF PRESIDENT DAVID BUTTERFIELD

David was born in South London in 1959. He lived with his family in various parts of England until he was 9 years old. His father, who was an ambulance officer, decided to seek a better life for his wife and six children so the family emigrated to Australia in 1969. They came out by ship. There is a story that David and his brother broke a pipe in the shower, and thinking the ship was sinking when all the water came out, ran naked through the ship yelling out “we are sinking, we are sinking!”

After the Butterfield family had been in Australia for about 6 years, home sickness set in and they went back to the U.K. in 1973. However, the rosy picture painted by relatives in England did not materialize and the family came back to Australia in October 1977.

In 1978, David started as a signwriter’s apprentice with C.H. Langhem, Signwriters. In 1982 David approached Ron Bidwell, who was the Employment Officer for the Sign Association seeking another position. Ron told him that Bruce Ruston was looking for an apprentice. Bruce took David on and taught him all aspects of the signwriting industry, which has changed quite significantly over the years. David did many a back drop etc for our recent Conference.

David bought the business from PP Bruce and his business is now situated at Chipping Norton so he now owns the company.

David met Julie who worked for the Reserve Bank (and who worked where the money was destroyed) at about the same time he started working for Bruce. . David and Julie have three boys, Michael who is training to be a police officer, Ryan and Liam.

David is involved in his church at Ingleburn and is very involved in Rotary. David has served as our Club President twice before in 2000—2001 and 2001—2002.
