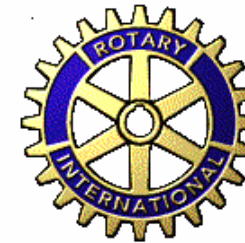


Declaration for Rotarians in Business and Professions

- Youth Exchange student arrival has been delayed will arrive on 26th July 2006 at 6.15 a.m.

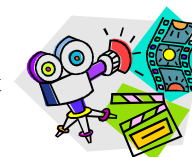
Discussions

MAX'S TRIVIA

The Crimean war was the first covered by camera. The equipment was bulky and the techniques of the time meant that photographs were still scenes of ships and people. Later photographs (still) were taken during the American Civil War and the Franco-Prussian War. Moving pictures came in early 1890's and the first screening of real life scenes was in 1895.



The first single engine aircraft flight began on the 8th January 1920 and reached Darwin on 2nd August after 208 days. Eight years later from 7th to 22nd February 1928, Bert Hinkler took 15 and 1/2 days. The Southern Cross of Smithy fame was previously owned by Australian Antarctic explorer G.H. Wilkins.
