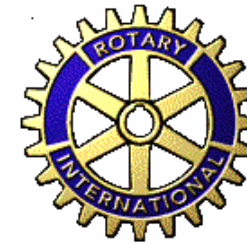

PE Margaret introduced Mali who is with Australian Volunteers International and is going to South India on 7th December 2006. There was a lot of countries to choose from but she choose India. It will cost \$10,500 and Mali is working 2 jobs to raise the money as she has to pay her own air fare which is \$2,150. Their aim is to conduct projects such as construction of school infrastructure, fences, school rooms, the installation of smokeless chulas (chimneys) in school kitchens, the arrangement of you/sporting events, the setting up of a school library and borrowing systems, painting educational murals with the children. Other fields will be addressed such as self help groups for women, and participate in community rallies and marches on environmental, health or empowerment issues. Mali is a student at University of Sydney studying Bachelor of Arts.
