Happy birthday to **PP George Roman** who will be celebrating his birthday on Thursday, 26.10.2006—have a great day George!.

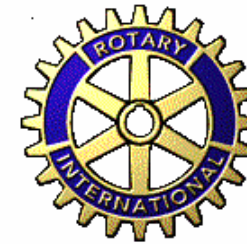
Also **PP Max Law** will see 25 years with the club having been inducted on 27.10.1980. Max was also a member back in 1976.

Vocational Service is Rotary's 2nd Avenue of Service and its purpose is to promote high ethical standards in all occupations, recognize the worthiness to society of all useful occupations and contribution of one's vocational talents to the problems and needs of society. Pride of Workmanship and Police Officer of the Year Awards come under this banner but there are a lot more and they include ARHRF, NESS (National Engineering Science School), NYSF (The National Youth Science Forum), SSS (The Siemens Science School) and ShellLive WIRE. We can help by using our own experience to help unemployed youth learn more about job opportunities and training programs, about how to write resumes and prepare for job interviews. Help promote employment opportunities within the community through promoting the work of local artists and craft workers and by recognizing vocational excellence through an award program of outstanding professional contributions of Rotarians, non-Rotarians and organizations.
