The first adding machine was invented by a French mathematician Blaise Pascal in 1642. A train of cogwheels enable numbers to be carried automatically.

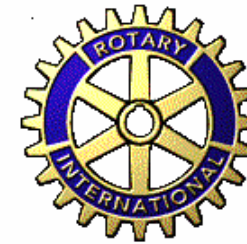
Pocket calculators introduced in 1971.
