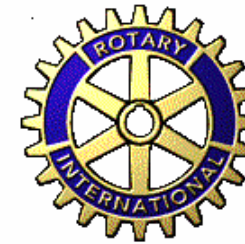


NOVEMBER IS ROTARY FOUNDATION MONTH

Service area and is organised as a separate corporation within RI. Rotary Foundation
was begun in 1917 by Arch Klumph, 6th International President of Rotary. He con-
vinced a convention that there was a need for an endowment for “doing good in the
world”.
Some of the programs are PolioPlus, individual grants for Rotary volunteers, Match-
ing Grants, District Simplified Grants, Ambassadorial scholarships, Rotary Grants
for University teachers, Group study Exchange, Rotary world Peace Scholars and 3-
H Grants.
