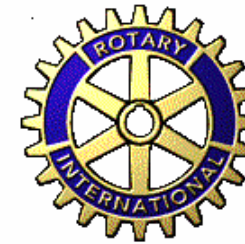
Most of the world's nations use the 625 line standard on a screen with the exception of North America and Japan.
