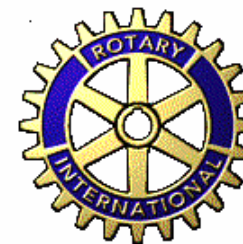
APRIL IS MAGAZINE MONTH
