also club anniversaries with **PP Boris and PP Graham** being inducted into the club on 5th June 1972 thus giving them 35 years service to the club.

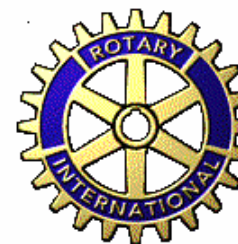

#### **MAX'S TRIVIA**

- Putting salt on a birds tail to catch it is just a story. If a bird was so close that you could put salt on its tail, you could get hold of it. However, salt is a symbol of incorruptibility (it never deteriorates), an emblem of immortality (it is a preservative) 
- Hors D'oeuvre comes from architecture. Things that were not in the blueprints were "outside the work", hors d'oeuvre. So when French chefs served—appetisers—before the main meal, it was outside their main work.
- An establishment opened in Paris in mid 1700's, serving mainly fortified soup. The owner had a sign in Latin "Come to me all you who suffer from hunger and I will restore (restaurabo) you. Restoration of hungry people caught on and created the modern restaurant.
