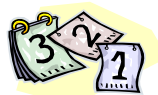

We have **PP Boris and Nada Satara** celebrating their wedding anniversary on Tuesday 29th April. Have a great day.



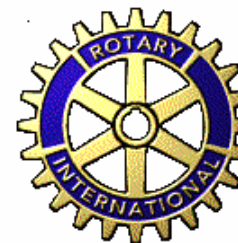
Also **Rtn Gaye Day** was inducted into the club on 30th April 2007 giving her 1 year of service to the club.
