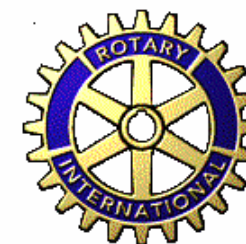
JULY IS LITERACY MONTH

MAX'S TRIVIA

1. There is a link between Voodoo and the Barbecue. Both came from the Island of Haiti. The natives devised their own method of preserving meat by smoking it on a wooden framework/grid called a BERBEKOPT. When the Spanish arrived they liked this method and pronounced the grid BARBACOA. In North America the grid became barbecue on which a whole ox was roasted. Eventually the barbecue roaster became very popular and it is now applied to outdoor parties as well as the food cooked there.
2. The Roman Empire was founded by Octavian, the adopted son of Julius Caesar in 27 BC. He became know as Augustus Caesar, the first emperor. The word Caesar is the origin of the German title Kaiser and the Russian Tsar.
