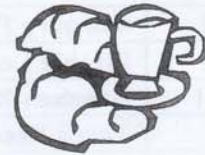

Ethnee reported that Rosecorp will sponsor a Spring Event to help with fundraising. The date for this is Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> September 2008 in Silverstone Park. She will keep us up to date of any developments. Pam and Ethnee will meet with Rosecorp in the near future.

Treasurer Doug reported that we have about \$2000 in our account.

Chrissi had contacted Canada Bay Council in regard to our looking after Wongol Reserve and they said they would be happy to work with us. We need to contact council to formalise what we can do. There is going to be a presence form Council in the park during weekend and signs displayed in different languages as to the use of the park.

Angela D'Amore, the local member for State Parliament addressed the meeting. She has been our state representative since 2003 and has a strong focus on health due to her nursing background. She suggested service being done with Concord Hospital which has 550 beds and particularly with the Intensive Care Unit. Another focus area suggested was the historic Yaralla site where \$2000-\$2500 can make a big difference. There is a growing demographic of young families to the area so there could be needs in childcare, pre-schools and schools. Doug brought up co- sponsorship with local govt as an issue during question time and Angela will supply us with a list of state grants.

Doug Pritchard gave a vote of thanks and the meeting closed at 8.25 a.m. with the singing of the National Anthem.
