Guest speaker on Monday 12th was Editor of the Macarthur & Wollondilly Advertiser, Jeff McGill, who revived our memories of Old Campbelltown with “Uncle Arties Slide Show”

To commence Jeff’s presentation highlighted the amount of Theatrical, Business, Military & Sporting greats that has come from the Macarthur & Campbelltown area. From the Boer War and the Campbelltown Mounted Rifles, World War 1 when the Light Horse & Camel Brigades training camp was situated at Menangle Park. In WW1 the volunteers from Campbelltown numbered 258 from such a small farming area and of those 40 paid the supreme sacrifice. In 1997 Jim Monroe and Jeff researched the history of the area as far back as the Boer War and a painting depicting the Campbelltown Light Horse in Africa was supposedly painted at Mosman. After some investigation and lobbying the Museum in Canberra recognised the site as Mount Sugarloaf in Campbelltown. The Slide Show then highlighted pictures of Campbelltown in the late 40’s.
