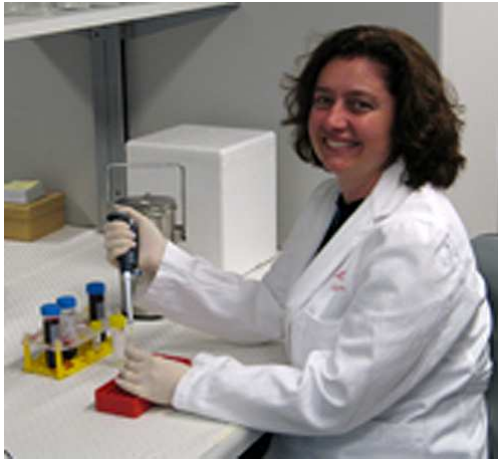

How does cancer spread?

Dr Elizabeth Williams, BSc (Hons), PhD

Senior Scientist and Research Fellow
Centre for Cancer Research

Dr Elizabeth Williams has worked in the field of cancer metastasis, focusing on prostate and bladder cancer, since completing her PhD in pharmacology in 1996. She joined the Centre for Cancer Research in 2006 to lead the cancer metastasis group.



Prior to joining MIMR, Dr Williams was an Associate Senior Fellow at the Department of Surgery, University of Melbourne and a Research Fellow (Prostate Cancer Group Leader) at the Bernard O'Brien Institute of Microbiology.

In 2005, she took on the role of Chair for the Think Tank on Prostate Cancer Models at the Australian Prostate Collaboration 7th Annual Meeting, and also chaired the Basic Science/Research Session of the Urologic Society of Australasia Victorian State Meeting.

She has co-authored 30 refereed journal articles, and is a referee for Cancer Research, International Journal of Cancer and Endocrinology. If you have any questions on cancer, now's the time to ask!

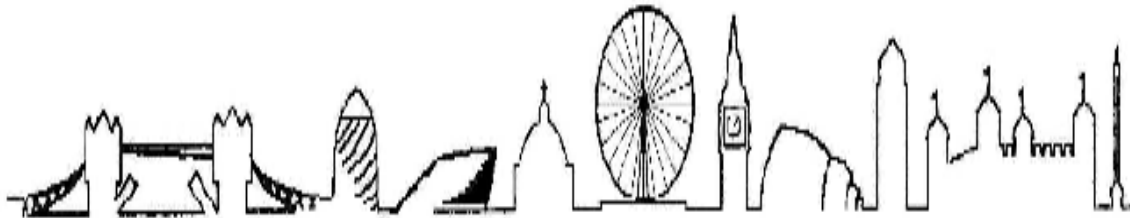

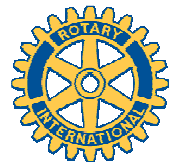

- Closure of on-line registration for students is May 15th.

- District interviews take place on Saturday July 21st.
- Orientation for the successful students will take place on October 14th.
- Session A occurs over the period 31/12/2007 to 12/1/2008
- Session B occurs over the period 14/1/2008 to 26/1/2008

The cost for a student attending the NYSF for 2008 has been set at \$1775.

Clubs are encouraged to contact their local secondary schools and ensure that the science teachers have alerted their students to the NYSF.
