Public Relations Grants

Thanks to the excellent promotional efforts by your District Governors and Public Image Resource Group members, we have received over 4,000 applications from 90 countries, a dramatic increase from the 170 applications received during last year's pilot program. We are very encouraged and truly touched by your enthusiasm in improving our organization's public image. At the same time, the large number of applications in various languages has created logistical challenges.

During the past week, all staff at the Public Relations Division has stopped our regular schedule to process the requests and continue to work during weekends. We want to review each application carefully and make sure your time and efforts are recognized.

Because of this large number of applications, there will be a delay in our response to you. Here is a tentative schedule:

Between now and the end of November - Submissions that have NOT met program requirements will receive their notification. There will be a detailed list of the reasons for denial. We encourage clubs to work with their Public Image Resource Group Zone Coordinators and make suggested changes so they may submit again for next year.

15 December – Begin to notify clubs that are eligible for funding. These first approved proposals have met all the requirements, with significant amount of club matching funds and donated media.

13 February – Begin to notify second round of approvals. These are good proposals with significant PR impact on their local communities, but they need to make minor modifications.

Once again, we apologize for the delay and we appreciate your understanding and patience. If you or the clubs have any questions, feel free to contact the Public Relations Division at prgrants@rotary.org.

Rotary PUBLIC IMAGE 24 Hour Meeting – 23/24 February 2007

WHY? I have been asked WHY a 24 hour meeting, the answer is simple we have so many projects, programs and activities in District 9810 that we will need at least 24 Hours to showcase them to the public and to the media. The 24 hours is about **“SELLING the Rotary Brand”** it is about **“THE ROTARY PUBLIC IMAGE”** and it is about having **FUN** telling our community about Rotary and why we are Rotarians.

We enjoy the Rotary Experience and so should others.

In brief the aim is to showcase the activities of District 9810 to all Rotarians and their family of Rotary, many of whom have never been to a conference (less than 45% of our Rotarians attend conference) and therefore perhaps have little perception of what others are undertaking, and to bring Rotary to the public and media, the later will be peppered with Press Releases during February.

Invitations to the opening dinner have been mailed to the Mayors and CEOs of all municipalities of our District and we are working on the additional 'A-List' invitees. A flyer with an invitation to Rotarians and partners to attend the dinner was emailed to clubs prior to

Christmas together with a flyer inviting District Committees and Clubs to set up displays at the 24 Meeting. The Governor of Victoria, Prof. David de Kretzer and Mrs de Kretzer will be special guests at the dinner and we anticipate Tony Robinson MLA - Cabinet Secretary and Hon. Jeff Kennett – AC will also join us at the dinner. Jeff Kennett will address the gathering on behalf of Beyond blue immediately after dinner and Tony Robinson has agreed to close the meeting on Saturday afternoon.

The 24 Hour Meeting Program is in the final stages of preparation but in the meantime the program in its present form has been issued to each Club President.

Preparation of Media Releases and flyers is well advanced, and will be widely distributed throughout the District. We will be asking the support of every Rotarian to ensure a saturation distribution throughout our District and beyond.

I am thrilled with the response from 9810 and in particular the Clubs that have drawn the short straw, the midnight to dawn sessions.

The committee and I have listened to the feedback and we have decided to remove the \$5 entrance fee replacing it with a request for a "Donation" as entry, coffee/tea and other catering will be available at a modest cost. Providing the catering on this basis will add to the logistics of the 24 Hour meeting, requiring Rotarians to man catering points rather than just having 'Service Stations' but we will face this hurdle as necessary as the event approaches.

All PROCEEDS from the 24 Hour Meeting will support our Rotary Programs in particular the Rotary Foundation.

PDG Philip Hedley, in his role as Secretary, District 9810 Nominating Committee, DG 2009/10, has today mailed to all clubs a call for Nominations for the DG Nominating Committee and for District Governor 2009-10. Pertinent details are as follows:

The Nominating Committee (refer clause 6 of District Bylaws 2005).

The committee comprises four representatives from Clubs who must be either a Past President or current Club President. (The other members of the Committee are District Governor, District Governor Elect, District Governor Nominee and Immediate Past District Governor).

Nominations must be submitted on the attached form and include a short CV of your Rotary experience. This will be included in any ballot correspondence if more than four Rotarians are nominated.

District Governor 2009/10

If a member of your Club is interested in considering this opportunity to serve Rotary, please encourage the applicant to speak with any member of the College of Governors as to the requirements of the role.

As a minimum, all applicants must:

- Be in good standing in their Club (i.e. financial).
- Have served as President of a Club for a full term or as specified in the Manual of Procedure, and
- At the time of taking office, must have completed seven years of membership with one or more Rotary Club.

Nominations open Monday 19th December and close at 5:00pm Thursday 25th January 2007

Interviews will be held on Sunday, **18th February, 2007** and applicants and their partners, if applicable, are required to be available on that date.

Application forms are available from PDG Philip, DG Bob or can be downloaded from the District website. Reference to the detailed requirements as shown in the Manual of Procedure 2004, on the role and responsibilities of the District Governor should be made.
