Last Week: Ben Woods – *International Society for Student Unity & Empowerment* (ISSUE). ISSUE was formed last summer

when 4 medical students from UTAS went to Uganda to conduct several projects – the main focus being malaria prevention. ISSUE in collaboration with students from South West Uganda have developed the Community Based Student Outreach Project (COBASOP), aimed at preventing and controlling malaria in rural regions of southern Uganda. With a population of 870,000, the commonest cause of illness and death in children is malaria. In Uganda alone, 70 to 100 thousand children under the age of five die from the disease! The saddest thing is that these deaths are completely unnecessary – malaria is 100% preventable, COBASOP aims to reduce the mortality from malaria by 90% in these regions with a four pronged approach: **1. Education** – a multi-level approach aimed at villagers, local leaders and health care workers.

2. Prevention techniques – including use of insecticide treated mosquito nets, home strategies to reduce mosquito breeding etc.

3. Diagnosis – includes provision of appropriate equipment to accurately diagnose - reducing those who are mis-diagnosed, thus using up valuable medication as well as those who are missed completely.

4. Supply of medical treatment – aiming to fill the massive gap left by the Ugandan government

ISSUE is hoping to raise \$68K by March next year. As well as reducing malaria and subsequent deaths, this program aims to promote a culture of student leadership and responsibility with regards to both local and global issues.
