Last Week: BEHIND THE BADGE: Our newest member **Jill Anderson** gave us an insight into her

background. She was born and raised in Hobart and has a German/Jewish heritage. She met her husband David while working at that well known confectionary establishment at Claremont. She was just 21 when they married. David was called up for National Service and they spent several years in various States during his time in the Army.

After his discharge, they moved to Penguin. By this time they had two daughters and Jill became a full time Mum (a very noble occupation!), until her eldest turned 12. She then worked in pubs and reckons she can pull a pretty mean beer! Later she opened a tea shop, which became more than full time and more than just a tea shop – she catered for weddings and funerals as well, from time to time and says she pretty quickly became a good ‘short order’ cook, especially when she ran out of things during the day and had to use what was at hand. She ran the shop for six years and then tried her hand with a pizza parlour! She said this was a good money earner and when someone walked in off the street and offered to buy not only the business but the house as well, she accepted and the family then spent three months overseas on some well-earned R & R.

Always the one to give anything a go, she worked as a Diversional Therapist for 10 years and loved working with the aged. She then ‘retired’ but volunteered with the Salvation Army Bridge Program, before being offered a paid position with them. This really opened her eyes to the drug and alcohol problem. After six years she left as the numbers of suicides were taking their toll.

A grandmother to 7, all of whom live nearby and to whom she is very close, she has now ‘fully retired’ BUT volunteers in the canteen and as a courier at RHH, and has now joined Rotary. A real ‘doer’ who clearly sees the glass half full! She certainly has not ‘retired’ from life!
